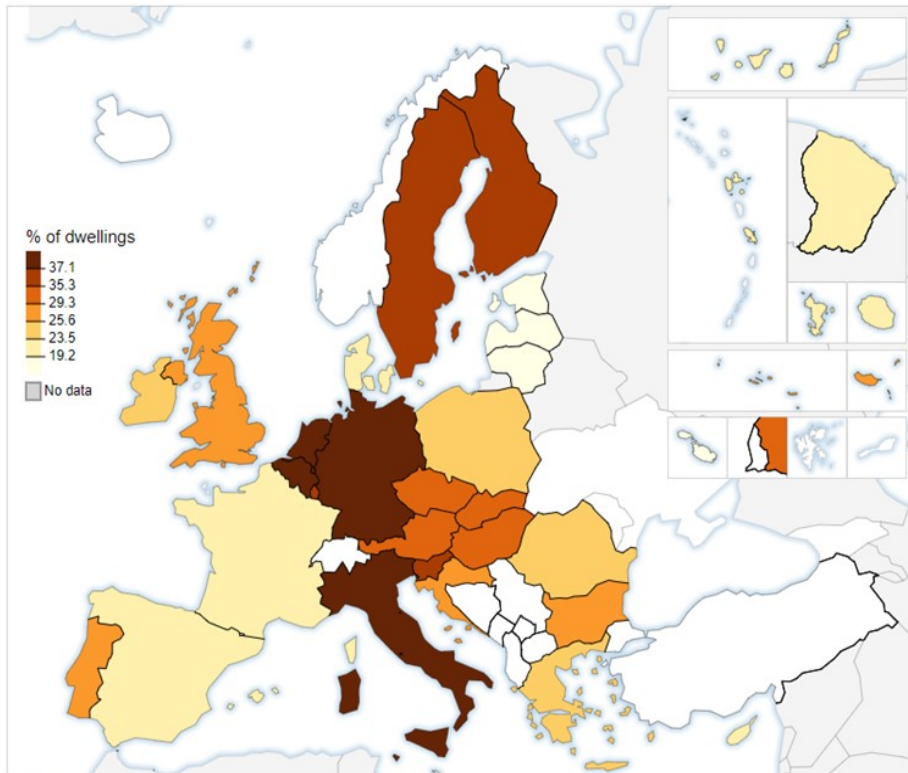
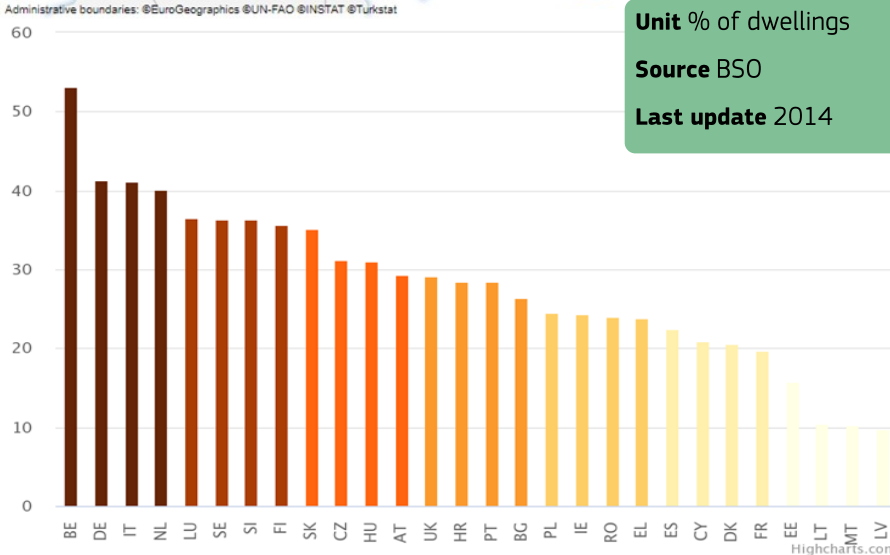


National indicator - Dwellings in Populated Areas

The “dwellings in populated areas” indicator disaggregate into two indicators which represent:

DEFINITION



- Dwellings in intermediately populated areas: share of dwellings located in intermediately populated areas (between 100 and 499 inhabitants/km²).
- Dwellings in densely populated areas: Share of dwellings located in densely populated areas (at least 500 inhabitants/km²)

The data displayed on this document is the disaggregate data for the **dwellings in intermediately populated areas**. The disaggregate data for the dwellings in densely populated areas are available on the dashboard once you have chosen the indicator.

The indicator can be an important one but it contains **limits**:

LIMITS



- It does not provide any direct information on energy poverty
- Energy poverty might vary according to territorial typology and population density
- It needs to be cross-analysed with indicators capturing the range of causes (economic, social, climatic, infrastructural)
